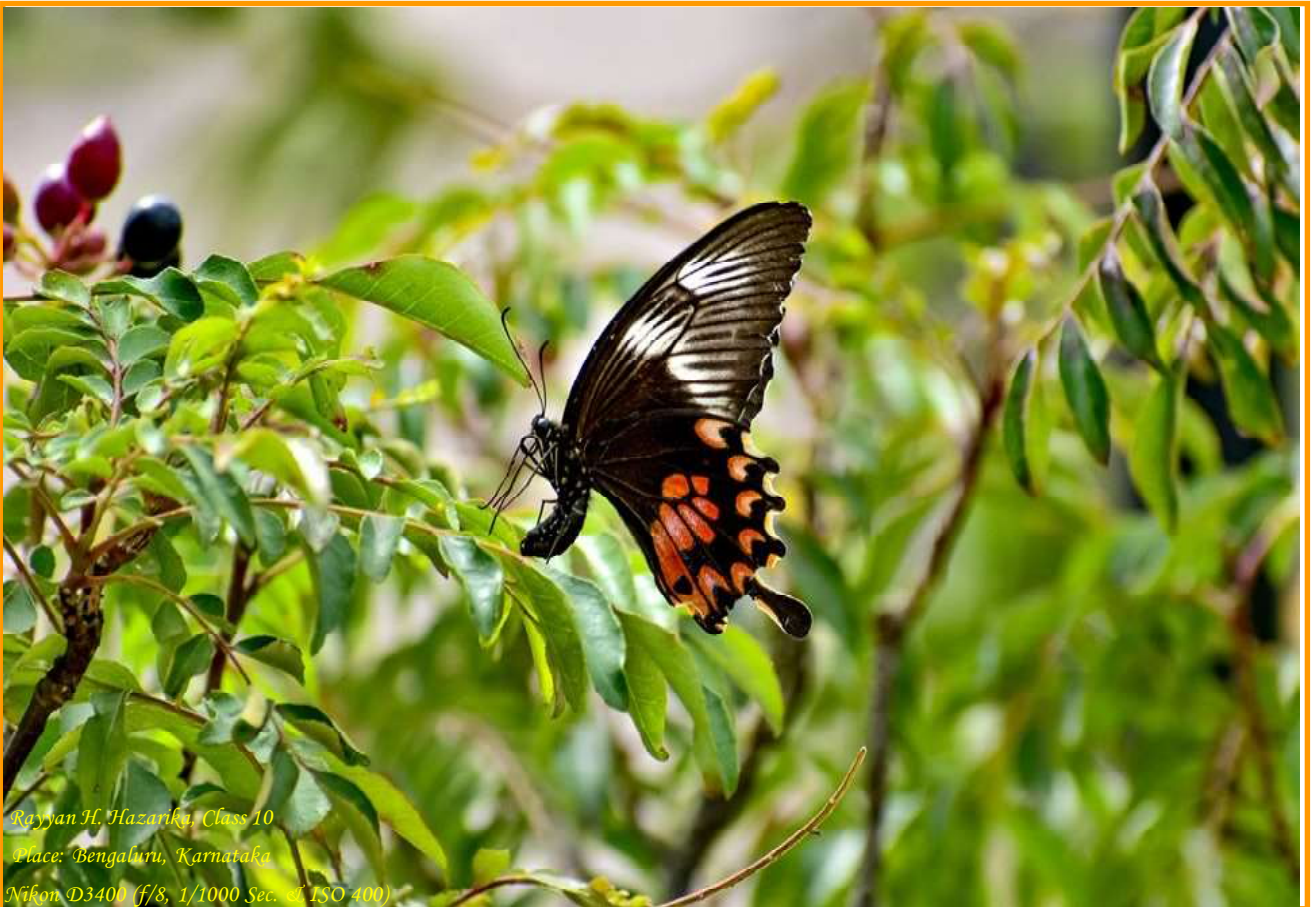

## LEGENDARY PHOTOGRAPHER

### WE MUST KNOW

### STEVE McCURRY

McCurry is an American photographer, freelancer and photojournalist. His photo "Afghan Girl" has appeared on the cover of National Geographic in June 1985. This portrait (captured in 1984) turned out to be one of those images that sears the heart. Her sea green eyes are haunted and haunting, and in them you can read the tragedy of a land drained by war. She became known around National Geographic as the "Afghan girl," and for 17 years no one knew her name. In 2002, National Geographic Television & Film's EXPLORER brought McCurry to Pakistan to search for the girl and they found her in the mountains near Tora Bora. Her name is Sharbat Gula, and she is Pashtun, that most warlike of Afghan tribes. She cannot understand the power of her eyes and how her picture has touched so many.
