Schools are the storehouse of rich historical records and being a part of the School Archives gives students a close contact with the school's history and enables them to realise and experience the process that goes in building up a good school. The collection comprises the Yearbook(s), flyers promoting and advertising musicals, theatre, dance, student elections, photographs, letters, issues of the school magazine, course catalogues, rare textbooks, student term papers about the school or community artefacts

such as trophies, flags, uniforms, donated objects, memorabilia and audio- visual materials.

The School Archives trained the Archives members in documenting their school life before and after the CoVid-19 Pandemic Lockdown. They created memory albums and videos to document their experiences and shared it with the school.

The Art Department in School works on projects involving familiarization to one's own culture, Theory and History of Art are introduced to the students for a sound knowledge base. Students work on indigenous themes and art movements of India and around the world, using various artistic mediums and techniques. The CDT curriculum facilitates the development and assimilation of an epistemic repertoire of 'material culture' by knowing the use of indigenous materials, ideating, planning, and learning to create for a purpose.

The Assam Valley School celebrated the 4th edition of 'Srijanyam' Art & Design Fest on a digital platform, on the 1st of August this year. Forty-one schools participated including from Bangladesh and Oman. The theme for the fest was 'Unlocking Creativity in the New Normal' -an effort to set an effective context in visual expression, for the difficult decisions coming up, as we plan to return to fulltime activity—a 'new normal' in the near future amidst the struggle to contain the COVID-19 pandemic.
