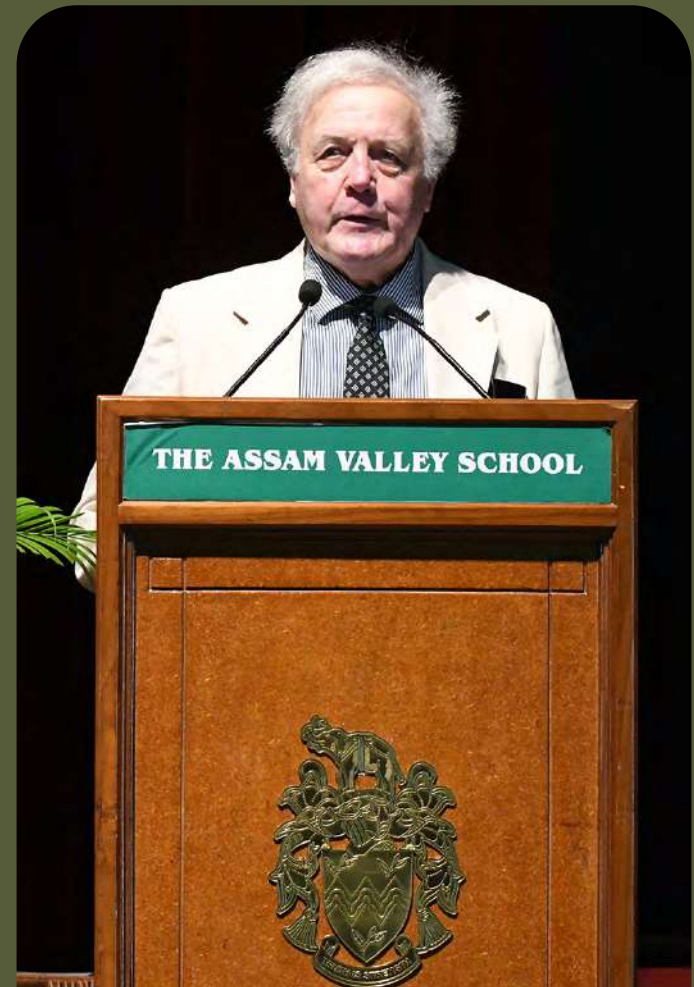
CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS

I quoted there from a letter of George Mallory, who may have reached the summit before dying on Everest's slopes in 1924; he wrote: 'If you cannot understand that there is something in man which responds to the challenge of this mountain and goes out to meet it, that the struggle is the struggle of life itself upward and forever upward. Then you won't see why we go. What we get from this adventure is just sheer joy. And', Mallory continues, 'joy is, after all, the end of life. We do not eat to live and make money. We eat and make money in order to live. That (joy) is what life means and what life is for.'

So I hope that you have had happy days in celebration of Founders and that the weeks ahead will bring you all success, especially for those facing Board exams. May AVS continue to be a school for learning, for adventure, for discovery, for hope, for aspiration, upward and forever upward. And may all who live and work here find in this journey a path to the joy that comes from a life fulfilled.





Speech Day

The Chief Minister begins his speech on a note of praise for The Assam Valley School, the infrastructure and quality of education of which is still the best in the entire Northeast of India. The very beginning of his speech depicts his confidence in the healthcare system of the state as he thanks the gathering for being present without masks, a symbol of accepting the rebounding system to normalcy. The honesty of the CM was appealing as he mentioned his upcoming elections saying his nervousness about it and comparing it with the examinations and the stress students go through too.

He applied this situation to the lives of students, saying that each one of us contain a truly unique potential and as students, we should strive to unleash it and then, the sky is the limit.

Mr. Summerscale, Chairman, and the members of Governing Body whose arrival at School during these auspicious days have traditionally marked the commencement of the celebrations of Founders'. While their presence is acutely missed, they remain with us here in spirit and it is the clarion call sounded by Mr. Summerscale to be 'ever onward and upward', that shall remain the vision which will guide us in all our enterprises in days to come.

The following lines from Robert Frost's remarkable poem 'The Road not taken' have left an indelible imprint on me. It was however over these months that I had the opportunity to yet again marvel at their relevance and measure my own decisions against the truth these words hold.

Two roads diverged in a wood, and I—

I took the one less traveled by,

And that has made all the difference.

Our Chairman had summed up my journey as Headmaster by saying that, "I doubt if any Headmaster has had to deal with riots, curfews, and now a pandemic in the course of his first term and a half at the helm!" I think the adversities have worked as catalyst and has now set us on the road to greatness.

At the onset of this address I wish to extend my deepest gratitude and appreciation to the Medical Team under the leadership of Dr. Dimple Baruah and Dr. Ansari who worked tirelessly to ensure that the School succeeded through phases of reopening of the campus and welcomed back students who have long been home, away from home.

System Administrator Mr Roopjyoti Das and his team's tireless efforts ensured the transition from the physical to the digital. Without them we won't have achieved, what we have achieved in last 11 months. The absolute truth of the matter remains that Mr. Rupjyoti Das remains our very own miracle worker. Along with his Team, they are our lifeline.

My heartfelt gratitude also goes to the Administrative Team who have worked persistently to ensure implementation of all SOPs. From the person entrusted with sanitization at the gate to those who doubled up their roles to ensure that the upkeep

of the campus did not want for hands, it has been a dedicated Team who have ensured that the School remained ever ready to meet all possible challenges.

Finally, to those who champion the vision of the School to make education the best adventure in the life of a child, Dear Teachers, this day, this year, would have been impossible without you. Your diligence, your persistence to do right by those who look up to you, have ensured that distance did not make learning distant. Your effort is what forges the pride of this Institution and you shall be remembered in posterity as warriors who fought to ensure the future of a generation was not lost to the dictates of a pandemic. We remain to you, eternally grateful.

Of the many lessons learned, unlearned and relearned in the year gone by, one reckons, the devil does indeed lie in details. These details lie in cogs and it is the effort of a Team that keeps the mechanism well-oiled to ensure it functions seamlessly. It was the effort and commitment of the Team that not merely fought off a pandemic but strengthened further the foundation of the institution we have gathered here today to celebrate.

At the core of the institution lies the framework of academics. The stronger it is, the taller would the ranks of its achievements rise. While ISC and ICSE results of the School speak for itself with class aggregates of 85.19% and the highest score peaking at 99.25% attained by Nugkivi Chishi, School Captain 2019, the attainment at the ICSE level reached yet another benchmark with Naviya Chamariya attaining overall 97.83% and Tanisha Garodia attaining 98.60% in English + best four subjects. Class aggregates were recorded at 86.95 %. Details of the results along with scores in different parallels have been communicated to all stakeholders over several correspondences across multiple platforms. The year of the pandemic however has highlighted yet again an important lesson we have long adhered to. Achievements in the form of numerics will remain significant for it has its own role to play in the scheme of affairs. What will remain unfazed and undeniable is the human effort to convert the average to exceptional through sheer grit and determination. The days of the Covid 19 showed clearly that where there is a will there will indeed be multiple ways that will bridge distances, find portals of learning and a resolve that will refuse to bow out to limitations. At AVS we seek to draw from our students the zeal to be life-long learners. We stand today in an ever changing world that seems to wrap itself around every miniscule possibility of an idea nudging, challenging and

creating within itself worlds that erstwhile had not existed. So the marks that fashion us cannot be the only testimony of achievement. What must therefore be the benchmark by which we measure growth, is the self that determines the goal then plans the road-map to reach it and then on charts the way through many odd and ends to finally reach what they had set out to.

Before the pandemic, as a Teaching unit we had been cruising on well-navigated waters, cushioned in the forte of our subject knowledge. Then came the Covid 19 and the best laid plans those unfailing practices that had stood the test of time, were all suddenly washed away. The bustling corridors stood empty, the class rooms with its white boards, shrouded in quiet, textbooks lay forgotten and the Main School Building stood under a silent siege. History within its multifold pages speaks of numerous tales of human perseverance and endeavour. I had the privilege of standing witness to it in these very grounds within these very walls. To accept weakness is wisdom, but to find the resolve to convert it into an asset, is a tale of courage and is the essence that continues to shape humanity. Teachers who in the blink of an eye shifted their entire classrooms from the physical to the digital adjusting, adapting and finally evolving to make their classes multifaceted using numerous online aids to ensure learning stayed unaffected. While this change was not easy it had been well prepared for. A primary focus over the year has been to ensure that we planned and invested on capacity building.

Learning is not stationary. It races with time, as teachers, we must keep pace in this race ensure that we teach our students not so much the use of technology for in that they remain leagues ahead. The important lesson then is to ingrain in them the ethics by which they can decide for themselves how to use what lay within their palms. That must be the single most essential contribution we continue to invest ourselves in.

At AVS, Sports have remained a significant parallel and the game of football the vibrant religion. The greens have been the grounds that have forged characters and build personalities. The tradition of bonding between seniors and juniors over teaching and learning the ropes of a game have long played a significant role in School life. The quest of refining a skill-set has given AVS Sportspersons of excellence in multiple games who have then gone on to represent the School, and the State in Inter-School and National forums. The beginning of 2020 saw Dhajen Basumatary, House Captain Lohit get selected to

represent the State in the SGFI games. As has long been the proud tradition of the School, many were also selected for IPSC games and district tournaments. The early months also saw Inter-House Cricket, Badminton, Basketball, Marathon and Athletics been conducted. It gave us yet another set of exceptional players and athletes who are today the proud recipients of the Blue Tie that marks excellence in the field of Sports. I am certain we shall see them set milestones and achieve greater heights in the days to come.

The pandemic demanded much from all of us and it posed a special dilemma for the Department of Sports which now dedicated itself to designing fitness programmes functional within the limits of the four walls. Thus began a series of weekly videos that catered to not merely physical fitness but also mental wellness. For the staff within campus, fitness programmes and Yoga sessions were conducted to ensure that Teachers stayed fit and the hours devoted to the static of their screens did not affect their health.

An important lesson learnt from the fields and one that remains highlighted in the periphery of memories was made during the Marathons. Having cheered the winners and the races completed the prize giving ceremony was well under way when one noticed a lone figure enter the grounds having clearly struggled to complete the demarcated stretch. Seeing the ceremony underway, the figure almost gave way and stopped. In the flash of an eye, the School Captain Param Nongmaithem, raced to his side and the entire School came together to cheer the runner on to the finishing line. The spirit of Sportsmanship once again shone through the day but it also bore clearly the mark of a Leader who led the community and helped them navigate through a difficult year. I extend my sincere gratitude to Param and his Prefectorial team. The year has been difficult and the Batch of 2021 have risen to meet the need of the hour at each step of the way. They embody the character of an Aviator and have together left a significant mark.

To the Event Management Team, under the remarkable guidance of Mr. Watts and the leadership of Satwik Keshan, your resourcefulness, presence of mind and eye for perfection is what makes events at School the grand successes they are. You truly are, one of a kind.

The famous lines of 'never let a good crisis go to waste', lived out its wisdom through the Activity Programme at AVS. The year of the pandemic saw this too converge on the online

platform. Nowhere more did it leave a deeper impact than it did on the cultural forum. Aviators took the opportunity to explore a wider range of prospects participating in a plethora of collaborative projects, inter school events, seminars and conferences on national and global platforms. School participated 34 inter school events since May. The highlights of the year remain the five events AVS hosted of which two were Round Square events one of them a Literary conference, the first in the history of the Round Square Society. Sriyanyam, an Art and Design fest organized by the Department of Art, Craft, Design and technology saw participation of 41 schools. AVS also hosted an Inter-School Music Competition which saw an exceptional pool of musicians send entries from across the county. The Inter-House Dance Competition saw compilations and dance routines which made the best of the online portal using ingenuity of talent to supersede distance. The highlight of the year was also the multiple Departmental Publications ranging from pure academia to a taste of art, culture and popular pop art form. We have published 62 editions of different publications since May. The School's newsletter AVE had continued work through the lockdown and have posted 31 Issues over the months. On its 25th year of existence, the Editorial Board has lived up to the tremendous legacy they carry. My congratulations to them. The Media Center under the guidance of Mr. Tapas Das and the leadership of Hrishiraj Surekha have shown significant progress through the year and their body of work is proof by itself.

A significant lesson hereby became the discovery of a medium that allowed collaboration. Where else could one learn this 21st century skill-set then in a platform that brought people over genres to blend their specific skill-sets and create something new. This is the new way forward and will be a forum to encourage. Thereby hung a tale of a pandemic that cornered us within walls but could not restrain the flow of creativity that found ways to convulse them into platforms of celebrations.

The greatness of an institution is graphed by the achievements of those who have passed through its gates. This year taking advantage of the new online platform, we had the opportunity of having many distinguished alumni now posted on a spectrum of forums meet us over a series of talks. These conversations shed light not only on what they have achieved but also strengthened our conviction that values learnt in school hold fast through the onslaught of time beyond these cherished

gates.

An important lesson reinforced yet again was the knowledge that the spirit of AVS was a collective memory passed from one generation to another. The heritage of this institution lies in the lives of all who wore with pride the legacy of being an Aviator.

They say that those who forget their History are doomed to be forgotten in the shadows of time. Those however who remain indifferent to theirs, will belong to none and be owned by neither the present nor the future, lost also to the past. It is difficult enough to study the subject but to appreciate its nuances and understand its dimensions, need a certain bent of mind. The easiest perhaps is to appreciate the moment when we see History being created, Nothing can constitute to the energy, the spark the sheer exhilaration of being part of a moment that creates History. That we have gathered here today as a community to celebrate the 25th year of this extraordinary institution, that we have journeyed over months undeterred by odds, that we have strived to uphold the vision of the School through every action, that we had not forsaken hope, that our shared goal remained through it all to uphold the striking emblem of 'Truth is strength', of patience exercised over the months, the multifold planning at every single parallel of School life, bears the remarkable testimony that human existence has been forged with- Perseverance. Together with you, our honoured Chief Guest, our treasured Board of Governors, Teachers and Students, dear Parents and Alumni, friends and all who have been part of this journey- together, you and I, we have created History. The 25th year of The Assam Valley School will have recorded within its prized pages the dedication and contribution of each individual whose efforts shaped the spirit of the Aviator, we celebrate today.

In this significant moment in time when we celebrate the coming of age of this relatively young institute whose influence and contribution to society at large belies its age; we also stand poised to step into yet another era of the School's trajectory. It is essential therefore that we spare a moment to contemplate the road ahead. In the times that unfold around us and the many events along with it, we witness major crisis that emanate from a trust deficit in society around us. This in turn trigger outbursts which rushes forth in voluminous crowds rudderless, ruthless and most certainly leaderless. They hold hostage to their whims and fancies the very institutions that are the bedrock of Democracies. While we laud technology

and promote the use of it, it reminds us yet again why it must remain a tool and not become the all-important force in our lives. The relevance of a Teacher and the role they play in the lives of their students become all the more significant. Before I conclude, my sincerest gratitude to the Senior Leadership Team, Mrs. Banu for the tremendous amount of patience, Mrs. Sahana Majumdar, for your grace and wisdom , Mr. Kuljeet Singh for being ever ready for the drama on and off stage Mr. Tushar Bharadwaj my comrade-in arms and fellow bearer of troubles, Mr. Apu Dey the handler of all things perennial, , Senior Mistress Mrs. Meenakshi Baruah Das and Mr. Huidrum, your keen eye keeps us at places we are supposed to be and away from the trouble that is always so enticing. thank you for your effort, your time and your diligence.

Finally to the two people who burn the midnight oil with me, Mr. Abhijit Baruah and Ms. Eva Parkentein, without your presence the papers would have stayed lost in the folds of the books. Thank you for always being there.
