What is a CV for Students?

CV is a summary of your academic, cocurricular, sports, skill and achievements. It is the first step to your college application.even It is the first impression on college counsellor/ authorities.

CV Do's:

- · Keep your CV to a maximum of two pages
- Bullet point your achievements and responsibilities, providing more information for your more recent roles
- List your education and qualifications, starting with the most recent first
- Include your IT skills, relevant training and spoken languages
- Ensure any outlined hobbies and interests are brief
- State that 'Referees can be provided on request'
- · Keep your CV current and up to date
- *Create a CV which is easy to read, logical and well word-processed
- ·Always check for spelling and punctuation mistakes get at least three different people to read it
- You do not need to be good at everything
 show what you are specifically good at

CV Don'ts:

- · Never make things up
- Provide every small detail of your life so far - the average employer will take 30 seconds reading your CV
- Use too formal language
- Never send a CV to college counsellor without a cover letter
- Try not to use a CV wizard or builder create your own document.

Typical CV format:

- · Contact details
- · Personal profile
- · Key skills and achievements
- Education and qualifications including training courses

- Work history including co-curricular activities experience and voluntary experience
- Personal/ Interests
- · References

The essence of what you want to communicate with your CV:

The following areas are crucial to creating your CV, but also form the essence of what you will want to communicate in an interview in order to successfully achieve the college admission:

- Your achievements academic, sports, cocurricular activities.
- · Your personality

Your Skills Include:

- Communication skills being able to talk, listen and present information
- Interpersonal skills being able to relate to other people, mix well, interested in people
- · Numerical skills being confident with numbers, basic arithmetic, math's etc.
- Analytical skills being able to analyze information and make sense of it
- Problem solving skills being able to offer solutions to problems, being able to work through tasks
- Team work skills the ability to work with others to achieve something
- Leadership skills being willing to take responsibility, and encourage others
- Information technology skills— the ability to use computers at basic or advanced levels
- Initiative skills the ability to work on your own without constant supervision
- Organizational skills the ability to organize your time and work to deadlines

Is Going Abroad Right for You?

There is great buzz around pursuing higher education abroad, and we want to help you find out whether going abroad is the right decision for you or not.

The first aspect to consider is that it is often costlier to study abroad than to continue your education in India. There are plenty of resources and opportunities available to help you finance your education abroad, and should be considered if you want to study abroad.

Secondly, the visa process and legal hurdles are something that are not faced by students studying domestically. This can be a challenge, and can deter many people from studying abroad. This is definitely something to consider when applying.

A common challenge faced by international students is the feeling of being lost and homesick. Though everyone faces this problem and gradually adjusts to it, some people often find it more difficult to adjust than others. This aspect can greatly affect your experience abroad, which is why it must be taken seriously before making a decision.

Finally, it comes down to your personal experience. It is essential to consider if the course you want to pursue is best served by going abroad, rather than staying in India. More often than not, many Indian institutions offer excellent education at par with foreign institutions, so it must be considered whether going abroad will truly be better for you than staying in the country. There are many university counsellors today that have made the foreign education process much easier by guiding you every step of

the way. Thus, the process much easier by guiding you every step of the way. Thus, the process has become much easier compared to past years. Going abroad for education after your school years is a big step that requires lots of thought. Do keep these few important aspects of the process in mind as you make your decision. Wishing you all the best!

Going abroad is an excellent option, but it should be remembered that scholarships are few and far between nowadays.

Also particularly in US Universities there are 6 things to consider:

- 1. Your transcript (i.e your report from class 9 onwards until your most recent examination.
- 2. Your personal essay (often called an SOP). Apart from this, some universities want you to write essays on prescribed topics.
- 3. Your CV. It should be crisp and not more than two pages. You must include all personal academics/sports/ co-curricular activities and positions held. However please remember to include mainly interschool, district national events not internal events
- 4. Your recommendations. Most US (and even UK) universities put great emphasis on this. YOu may need a Counsellors LOR but some universities want academic references with references to what you intend to study. For instance if you intend to study science, your physics or math teacher's references would be handy
- 5. As students whose mother tongue is not English you would need to do TOEFL or IELTS.
- 6. Your SAT score however when you do your research, then see whether the university insists on SAT or makes it optional. Most top class universities (i.e the Ivy Leagues), usually want a SAT score of 1450/1600 and above. As for scholarship it will depend on your total application. Above all, don't be in a hurry. Take time over your research. And don't apply immediately for financial aid. Sometimes colleges and universities have internal scholarships which they don't advertise but award you once you get admission. Both Sneh, and Jigyasa got those. All the best!
