

# International options

#### Australia

Australia is an excellent place for students to improve their education. Every year, universities in Australia receive a large number of applications from students all around the world.

Australian universities have admission criteria for applicants. To be eligible to apply to these universities, you must take particular entrance exams. Here are some of the tests that universities in Australia accept: IELTS, TOEFL, PTE Academic, CAE, GMAT Intakes for admission to Australian colleges and universities are held twice a year. The main opening inflow is in February and July. In Australia, this admission cycle is when all main courses are admitted.

## Eligibility Criteria:

- 1. Admission to diploma level courses requires applicants to have scored 60% marks in the class XII examination.
- 2. For bachelor's degree admission, students must have scored at least 65% and above marks in class XII.

## Application Requirements:

- 1. Official passport copy
- 2. 10th mark sheet
- 3. 12th mark sheet / predicted result
- 4. 2 letters of recommendation
- 5. Statement of purpose

The application deadline for Feb 2023 is 30 October 2022 and July 2023 application deadline is yet to be confirmed.

## United Kingdom (UK)

The UK is known as a multicultural country and is also immensely popular with international students. Universities in the UK allow students from around the world and learn so much more than just what you are studying on your degrees. UK universities offer several opportunities to international students. Some benefits of the UK are-

### Important dates for admission are:

- 1. 3 October 2022: 2023 entry application deadline for most UCAS Conservatoires music courses.
- 2. 15 October 2022 (18:00 UK time): 2023 entry deadline for the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, and most courses in medicine, veterinary medicine/science, and dentistry.
- 3. 25 January 2023 (18:00 UK time): 2023 entry deadline for all UCAS Undergraduate and Conservatoires applications, except for those courses with a 15 October deadline.

### United State of America

The United States of America (USA) hosts the most international students in the world. Quality education, a unique curriculum, a multicultural environment, and abundant opportunities are just some of the reasons why many Indian students want to study in the USA.

There are over 4000 options for higher education in the US. To get admission to any of the universities in the US, English proficiency is required. Tests like TOEFL, IELTS, Duolingo, and PTE Academic: Pearson English tests can be used to assess English proficiency.

Required university application documents

Different universities and programs will require different documents. However, these are the items you are most likely to need if you apply to a university in the US:

- 1. Transcripts or records of grades (high school and/or university)
- 2. Résumé/CV
- 3. Test scores (SAT, ACT, GRE, GMAT)
- 4. Proof of English-language proficiency

# University application deadlines in the US

If you are applying for an undergraduate (Bachelor's) degree in the US, universities will typically offer two application deadlines - early admission and regular admission.

- 1. If you're applying for the fall (autumn) admission, early deadlines will be between October and November, of the previous year.
- 2. If you're applying for the fall (autumn) admission, regular admission deadlines will be between February and March, the same year.

# Scholarships

### Australia

Australia offers many scholarships for international students. The grant of scholarship is basically on merit and the students have to demonstrate their eligibility for the scholarship they are applying for. There are no qualifying exams for scholarships in Australia. The only exam that the students may have to take is the IELTS to demonstrate their English language ability.

### Australian Awards

The Australian Government has made a range of study and research awards available to candidates in the Asia Pacific region, including India, under the Australian Scholarships Program. Details and application forms for all awards can be found at www.australiaawards.gov.au

### These awards include:

Australian Leadership Awards (ALA) for longer-term post-graduate study in Australia at the masters or doctoral level. The scheme is competitive and is managed by the Australian Agency for International Development (AusAID). Preference is given to candidates who can demonstrate that they are in a leadership role or have the potential to assume a leadership role.

Awards are open to all fields of study, however, study programs that relate to the priority themes of international trade, pandemics, security, and climate change (including clean energy) are encouraged.

Applications for the 2010 ALA intake open on 10 March 2010 and close on 30 June 2010 for commencement at an Australian university in January 2011. Application forms and details about the scheme can be found at www.australiaawards.gov.au. ALA scholarships will be allocated equitably between men and women.

### USA

Foreign Fulbright Student Program

The Fulbright Program is a full scholarship in the USA for international students who want to pursue a Masters's or Ph.D. degree. Scholarships can also be awarded for non-degree postgraduate studies. The grant covers tuition fees, textbooks, airfare, a living stipend, and health insurance.

Humphrey Fellowship Program

The Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program provides a year of professional enrichment in the United States for experienced professionals from designated countries throughout the world. Fellows are selected based on their potential for leadership and their commitment to public service in either the public or private sector. The fellowships are full grants covering all related expenses.
