#### AFS

The culture of Varanasi was shown to the students by taking them to religious sites, through performances and also by having authentic food stalls for students to try their cuisine. There were keynote speakers who addressed the participants and who gave them an insight on how they can help in the development of the community as a whole and also on how to expand their extent. It was an enriching experience with excellent exposure for students.

## Science Colloquium

The colloquium was a great opportunity for the Class 12 students to share their knowledge in science and to hone their oratory skills; for the Class 11 students - we learned new things. #### Experiential Learning




