



Upper School Inter-House Debate



The Upper School Inter-House English Debates were held from the 18th to the 21st of May, 2022. The first three days passed in a whirlwind as the Preliminary Rounds were held and by the end of it, Jinari-Manas bagged first position, heading straight to the finals. This time, the Knockout Round was between Subansiri-Namdang and Bhoroli-Lohit for a place in the finals.

The motion for the Knockout Round was "Animals should be kept off the menu." Though a motion quite familiar to most, the speakers weaved commendable speeches with ingenious arguments. However, the motion was lost and Bhoroli-Lohit were declared the winners, earning them a place in the finals.

The highly-anticipated Finals took place on the evening of the 21st, in the AVR due to the weather, much to the dismay of many. However, the enthusiasm and energy in the packed room truly made up for it. The motion for the finals was "This House believes that in today's world, experiences are far more valuable than material possessions." Jinari-Manas were proposing the motion, while Bhoroli-Lohit were opposing it. Speeches varied from suave and composed, to warm and relatable. The end of the debate also marked the end of the Inter-House debates and it was apparent that the audience had gauged that there was no better way to end it. The Most Promising Speaker award went to Jikke Kikum, while the Best Speaker award was tied between Kekhriesino Meyase and Hiyaneijemmy Das. The motion was lost and the coveted winners were Bhoroli-Lohit.

Lower School Inter-House Debates

The Lower School Inter-House English Debates were held from the 4th to the 7th of May, 2022. The first three days were packed with the Preliminary Rounds with motions ranging from the impracticality of electric cars to student loan forgiveness. At the end of the preliminary rounds, Subansiri-Namdang secured first position and went straight to the finals while Bhoroli-Lohit and Jinari-Manas faced each other in a Knockout Round, which would decide who joined the Spartans in the finals.

The motion for this round was "This House believes that films influence people's behaviour." Jinari-Manas was proposing the motion while the blues opposed it. By the time the debate was over, everyone's nerves were on edge, anticipating the results. Bhoroli-Lohit ended up winning the debate, and moved to the finals.

The much-awaited Finals were held on the evening of the 7th under the imposing lights of the Central Courtyard. The motion was "This House believes that the death penalty has no place in a civilised society." Once again, Bhoroli-Lohit were opposing the motion, while Subansiri-Namdang supported it. The speakers all



spoke with poise, flair, and wit that was beyond their years. Each speaker pulled you more towards their stance and by the end of the debate, it was impossible to discern who the winners were.

To a riveted audience, the results were declared that the motion was carried, and Subansiri-Namdang won the debate. Aanya Paul Sarkar and Natasha Billimoria were jointly declared Best Speaker, while the Most Promising Speaker award went to Swadheen Banerjee.

Upper School Hindi Debates

The 14th of May, after a week of scintillating debates, saw the resounding finale to Bharat-Ratna 'Pandit Atal Bihari Vajpayee' Inter-House Debates (Upper School). It saw the might of Kopili -Dhansiri and Jinari-Manas brace for a fight. Kopili-Dhansiri represented by Anushka Jitani, Praveka Kasera, Dayan Hazarika, and Nihal Agarwal were for the motion 'Western influence is polluting Indian culture' while Jinari-Manas represented by Raghav Agarwal, Utkarsh Jajodia, Ahsash Agarwal and



Aakanksha Kumar opposed the motion. The judges for the final debate were the Head of Upper School, Dr Kuljeet Singh, the Dean of Activity, Admissions and Marketing Mr. Tushar Bharadwaj and the Deputy Head Academics, Mrs. Shakila Banu. Kopili-Dhansiri based their argument on practices from ancient India that have been diluted along with an insight into the history of British India. They also spoke about the importance of language and food in culture. Jinari-Manas argued that it was the positive influence of the western world that our country was developing and compared Sanskrit to a bouquet of flowers. They quoted the rich lyrics 'Hind desh ke nivasi sabhi jan ek hain' and spoke about the abolition of social evils such as child marriage due to the positive impact of westernization. The evening came to an end with Anushka Jitani of Kopili-Dhansiri being awarded the Most Promising Speaker while the Best Speaker was awarded to Raghav Agarwal of Jinari-Manas. The motion was lost and Jinari-Manas emerged winners.







WELMUN





We have successfully constructed 54 chulas which are distributed to the Sessa community. The project will continue by spreading the idea to the nearby villages and make the people understand the importance of it. We have tried to expand the project to The Holy Kid's School, Phulbari during our visit and demonst rated the mechanism.

Plantation drive in Tezpur

The Social Service League took the initiative to do a plantation drive of planting 1500 saplings in different places of Tezpur, on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of the school's establishment. It was an eight-day programme where students from classes 5 to 8 took part along with teachers and student leaders from class 12 who oversaw that the drive would go on smoothly. Around one thousand saplings were planted during this programme in different places of Tezpur such as Joymoti Pathar, Polo Field Children Park, Jahaj Ghat, District Library, Cotton Road, Silver Jubilee School, etc., with various shade bearing and flowering plants such as Kanchan, Krishnachura, Azar, Xunaru.













Use of old unused copies of students





After completion of the semester ending examination the SSL volunteers segregated the used copies in all the boarding houses and separated the unused pages from the copies. The main objective of this project is to make diaries by students from those unused pages and give them to the teachers and students of nearby schools.

'Anaemia Mukt Bharat' Abhiyaan ('Anaemia Free Bharat' Mission)

It is a government project providing iron syrup / capsules to women on a weekly basis. It started on 8th March, 2022 with the AVS girls' community. On a weekly basis the girls are provided with Feronia XT iron syrup. In collaboration with the government hospital we have collected iron tablets for the lady support staff and distributed the tablets among them. It is a long term project and the SSL team will try to reach out to the women living in the nearby villages to educate them about the importance of a healthy life.

Construction of Toilet in Chowk Bazaar

On 10th June 2022, over 300 shops were gutted after a major fire broke out at Chowk Bazaar, Tezpur, Assam. To help the shopkeepers of the Chowk Bazaar,



whose shops were destroyed, the Social Service League of AVS undertook the initiative to reconstruct the Chowk Bazaar toilet. The entire school community including students and staff have contributed to raise funds for this noble cause. Our school, in collaboration with the Tezpur Municipal Board has constructed a toilet with 7 compartments for the shopkeepers.

Literacy Programme

The Social Service League volunteers visit The KGMT School (Kasturba Gandhi Memorial Trust) in neighbouring Hurchurah and The Holy Kids School Phulbari on a regular basis. The main objective of visiting these schools is to share thoughts and knowledge with those children.



Visit to Missionaries of Charity

The SSL members visited the Missionaries of charity. The children's Play Park and the wooden furniture were painted by our volunteers. We regularly visit this institute and spend time with the physically challenged children. It gives us motivation and inspiration to serve society.

Flood Relief Programme

The Social Service League of The Assam Valley School takes active part in the flood relief programme during the monsoon season whenever the flood affects the lives of the local people. The team visits the flood affected areas of nearby villages and provides them with food and other daily use materials such as phenyl, bleach and detergent.









Moran Blind School

The Social Service League recently paid a visit to the Moran Blind School. There were fifteen of us. It was a three-day service programme. The programme was truly enriching and splendid. The entire team offered heartfelt gratitude to the management for providing such an amazing opportunity.

Activities during these three days included:

- 2. Serving meals for the MBS students.
- 3. Visited the Kalyan Ashram (old Age home) and spent quality time with the people.






