

THE ASSAM VALLEY SCHOOL REPORT BY SOCIAL SERVICE LEAGUE YEAR-2023-24

The Social Service League is an integral part of our school activity program and the students take part in it with great enthusiasm and dedication to provide their selfless service to society. This year a new initiative has been taken by the SSL of AVS under the project – ‘Experiential Learning in the field of Community Service’, with the objective of engaging each student in community service programme. In this framework students from all classes got the opportunity to connect and offer their service to the community.

Throughout the year the SSL has conducted both long-term and short-term activities a glimpse of which is displayed below.

1. Anaemia Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan- This campaign aimed to raise awareness about anaemia, endorse regular health check-ups, and distribute iron-rich supplements to combat this prevalent health issue. It was a concerted effort to enhance our neighbourhood’s well-being and support the development of a nation free of anaemia.



2. Anti-tobacco campaign- This initiative aimed to combat this health hazard, promote a tobacco-free lifestyle, and create a healthier and smoke-free environment for all through interactive workshop, awareness drives, and anti-smoking initiatives.



3. Cancer hospital Visit - Our students visited the Cancer Hospital in Tezpur. This visit provided students with a poignant opportunity to gain insights into the challenges faced by cancer patients and inspiring empathy and support for those battling this disease.



4. Literacy Programme in Holy Kids School- The students from our school's Social Service League visited the Holy Kids School, where they engaged the students in exciting math activities through simple worksheets, sparking their interest and enthusiasm for the subject and held poem recitation and painting competition along with various other activities and awarded them for their sincere efforts and eagerness.



5. Fund raising fete- The main objective of this activity was to raise funds for various outdoor community service projects. This fete was not based on mere donation but we organized it in the form of a fest where our students set up various games and food stalls, the centre of attraction being the cotton candy machine. These stalls entertained the students in return for their donations.



6. Kitchen service- The students participated in kitchen service within the school's facilities, offering them valuable insights into the meticulous planning and effort required to prepare meals for the entire school. This experience cultivated a deeper understanding and respect for the hard work of the kitchen staff.



7. Laundry service- The children engaged in laundry service within the school's facilities to gain a firsthand understanding of the workload and challenges faced by the dedicated workers, fostering appreciation and empathy for their contributions to the school community.



8. Awareness on Menstrual hygiene- Our School's SSL team organized an impactful "Menstrual Hygiene Campaign," aiming to break the taboo surrounding menstruation, educating females about their menstrual health, and providing essential hygiene products to empower young individuals with the knowledge and resources they need to manage their menstrual health confidently and comfortably.



9. Visit to Missionaries of Charity- The students paid a heartwarming visit to the Missionaries of Charity, dedicating their time and efforts to bring joy to underprivileged females who had been rejected by their families. Their compassionate interaction aimed to deliver not only companionship but also a sense of belonging and support to those in need.



10. Blind School Visit- Our school's Social Service League students embarked on a meaningful visit to the blind school located in Nagaon, where they interacted with visually impaired individuals, learned about their unique experiences, and participated in activities that emphasized inclusivity and support for the visually challenged.



11. Visit to Bokakhat Children Home: -

On 02.10.23 we visited Bokakhat children home. The main goal was to learn about the predicament of children who are the victims of child abuse and child labour and to look into methods that we can offer our support and assistance. This visit taught us a lesson on how important it is to solve the problems of child abuse child labour in our society.



12. Community Lunch:-

As part of their commitment to the community, SSL volunteers went to the community meal this year on the occasion of Durga Puja and distributed the guests "Bhog."
